Ken started playing the trombone at school in Aylesbury (England) in 1958 after being inspired by Jack Teagarden.


He joined Ellesborough Silver Brass Band but only having a baritone available he played in the school orchestra to get a loan of their trombone to play in the band, thus learning to read treble and bass clef.

Ken has moved a bit over the years from England, Wales, Zambia and finally to New Zealand. Along his journey he played in many bands from Jazz, Warm up Bands for Rag Balls, Pit Orchestras for local shows, brass bands and our Bavarian Beer Band. Ken has even met Harry Mortimer, an adjudicator at a contest when the Patcham Parish Brass Band (one that he played for at the time) won the 4th Grade.


In 1974 Ken left for New Zealand staying with his brother in Rotorua until getting work with NZAS and he moved down to Invercargill. He joined up with the IGB in 1974 but due to shift work practice was sparse and with an abundance of trombones in 1975 he marched with a cornet filling a spot at the Nationals.

In 1979 Ken volunteered to help with the percussion section playing the tymps mainly to help out Marjorie (Rodney Sutton's sister) who joined the band at that time. He kept playing his trombone and started helping out the Boys Band, volunteering to play in the Bavarian Band when Brian Eckersley wasn't available and joined the Crazy Rhythm Big Band (now the Invercargill City Big Band).

Ken retired from the Senior Band in 2000 as the music became very difficult and too technical for his tastes. He still continues to play for the Auxiliary Band to help the kids out on his Bass Trom.
